CONNECTING OUR COMMUNITY

Have you been to the Portage Riverwalk? This natural, rustic trail begins and ends at Fifth Avenue and Hoffman Street, following the Portage River. The park offers river views from elevated trails and leaves you feeling like you've left the city for a more natural destination. In 2019, the River Country Recreational Authority will begin working with St. Joseph County Parks Department to construct the first of two scenic overlooks along the existing trail path.

The overall goal for the city is to expand this natural network of trails from Downtown to the Hidden Marsh Sanctuary, approximately 1.7 miles.
