Renewal

The City of Three Rivers currently provides its residents with continued street and sidewalk improvements using funds from a dedicated millage that was passed in 2002, by a vote of the people. On November 8th, 2016, you will be asked if that millage should be renewed for another 15 years.

Renewing the current 3.7 mills will not increase city taxes. If the streets and sidewalk millage renewal proposal passes, by a majority vote, city residents would continue to pay what they are currently paying.

A public meeting on the proposal will be held on Tuesday, October 25th at 6:00 p.m. at the St. Joseph County Commission on Aging.

BENEFITS

- ✓ NO tax increase - continue to pay what you are currently paying
- ✓ Funds are used for the sole purpose of street & sidewalk removal and replacement
- ✓ Restricted funds guarantee timely improvements for another 15 years

Improvements funded by the current millage:

Broadway Street and Portage Avenue first streets reconstructed with millage - routine maintenance performed on both streets. Utility improvements were also completed.

Spring St (northern portion), Enterprise Drive, and S Constantine St reconstruction funded through MDOT grant. We pay a 20% match for the construction.

In 2011 and 2012, water system improvements came with partial street reconstruction including Maple St, West St, 8th St, River St, and Walnut St.
